

## The Do's and Don'ts of Academic Integrity

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Academic Honesty	Academic Dishonesty
Spending the time, energy, and effort needed to complete the assessment	Doing anything that lets you spend no time, energy, or effort to complete the assessment
Asking someone to help you	Asking someone to do the work for you
Having a tutor help you comprehend an assignment question, give you guidance towards an answer, or having them answer a similar problem	Having a tutor answer an assignment question for you prior to the due date
Discussing assignment problems with your peers, separating, and constructing your own independent answers based on your understanding of the problem (i.e. no notes from discussions)	Copying full or parts of solutions from peers, or dividing up questions on an individual assignment between peers with the intent to share answers afterwards
Showing a peer how to do an example or technique from class	Giving full or partial answers to assignment questions to your peers prior to the due date
Looking at the internet for background information regarding an assignment problem	Looking up the answer to an assignment problem on the internet or posting an assignment problem to the internet
Using social media to discuss answers with your peers after an assessment is due	Using social media to discuss answers with your peers before an assessment is due
Performing computations yourself and using technology to check your answers	Using technology that has not been approved to do all of the computations for you
Completing an examination by yourself	Consulting other individuals or non-authorized materials during an examination
